

Safety - Match - Reach Schools

How do you decide which schools to apply to and which you have a good likelihood of being accepted into? A helpful process for determining this is by identifying your **Safety, Match, and Reach schools**. Safety schools are colleges or universities that you almost certainly will be admitted to, Match schools are those that you have a good chance of being admitted to; and Reach schools are those that you have a smaller likelihood of being admitted to.

If you already have some colleges or universities in mind, look up the admission requirements for those particular schools to see where your credentials fall within their requirements.

Reach Schools


Write in schools where your academic credentials fall at the minimum to lower-end of, or slightly below, the school's requirements.

Match Schools

Write in schools where your academic credentials fall well within, or even exceed, the school's requirements.

Safety Schools

Write in schools where your academic credentials fall near the higher-end of, or above, the school's requirements.
